

Join the People's Choice Award Stockholm Junior Water Prize 2020!

Who do **you** think deserves to win the 2020 Stockholm Junior Water Prize People's Choice Award? For the first time ever, the annual Stockholm Junior Water Prize is complemented by an award from the audience, so that you can vote for your favourite project.

Stockholm Junior Water Prize is an international competition for people between the ages of 15 and 20 who have conducted water-related projects of proven environmental, scientific, social, or technological significance. The projects range from local or regional to national and global topics. After a first round of national competitions, the winners from all 32 participating countries compete for the international prize. Their projects are assessed by a jury of leading water experts who select the winning idea. Despite the pandemic, the winners will be presented by H.R.H Crown Princess Victoria of Sweden as in previous years, though this year the award ceremony will be held online.

Read the participants' projects, watch their 3-minute elevator pitches and make your choice!

Not sure how to evaluate the projects?

Below are some of the points that the official jury uses when making their decision – will you come to the same conclusion?

- Does the project benefit both the environment and society?
- Is the project relevant, is it addressing a real and important challenge within the water environment?
- Does the project raise and increase awareness on water issues?
- Are the discussions and suggestions creative and innovative?
- Are the purpose, methodology and results presented in an informative and understandable way?
